As an Apprentice, you will develop your professional carpentry skills to observe, analyse, evaluate, and undertake various carpentry projects as if you were the Carpenter.

Course Duration

Typically, this Apprenticeship will take four (4) years to completion; less if you show you are acquiring all the necessary skills and knowledge in a shorter time frame.

The majority of your training will occur in the workplace, overseen by your employer and assessed by TIV's qualified Assessors. In addition, you will also attend TIV's Trade School two (2) days per month over ten (10) months of the year to ensure you have a well-rounded experience of carpentry particularly in providing opportunities to practice skills that may not be available in your workplace.
